




- Who are Third Culture Kids (TCKs)?

DAVE POLLOCK'S TCK DEFINITION


"A person who has spent a significant part of his or her developmental years outside the parents' culture(s)...







WHAT THE THIRD CULTURE IS NOT



CLARIFICATION: INDIVIDUALS CAN FEEL "GREEN" BUT THAT IS NOT THE THIRD CULTURE

-Although elements from each culture are assimilated into the TCK's life experience....
- the sense of belonging is in relationship to others of similar background.

MAIN CHARACTERISTICS OF SHARED THIRD CULTURE BACKGROUND

- Cross-cultural lifestyle
- High mobility
- Expected repatriation
- Often a "system identity"



THIRD CULTURE COMMUNITIES INCLUDE... (WHAT'S YOUR STORY?)




- Third Culture Adults (TCAs) Those who make their first long-term international crosscultural move as adults.
- Third Culture Kids (TCKs) "Children who accompany their parents into another culture."
 - -Ruth Useem's definition
- Adult Third Culture Kids (ATCKs) Those who grew up as TCKs
- Third Culture Locals (TCL?) citizens of the host country who interact and work with expats


WHO WE ARE WE TALKING ABOUT MOST MKs/TCKs ARE ALSO CCKs


- ▶ A Cross-Cultural Kid (CCK) is a person who is living in—or meaningfully interacting with two or more cultural environments for a significant period of time during developmental years of childhood (first 18 years of life).
 - A Cross-Cultural Adult (CCA) is one who made first significant cross-cultural interaction as an adult
 - Adult Cross-Cultural Kid (ACCK) is someone who grew up as a CCK.

WHAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT: CHANGE

- What is change?
 - Both verb and noun
 - Verb



- Noun:
 - A transformation or transition from one state, condition, or phase to another



CHANGE/TRANSITION CAN BE POSITIVE

First changes

- Creation from "without form and void" to the world we have
 - God saw that it was good
- Change from bachlerhood to married state Adam



CHANGE CAN BE HARD FIRST TRANSITION DUE TO PHYSICAL RELOCATION



COMMON REASONS CHANGE/TRANSITION HAPPEN FOR EVERYONE, INCLUDING MKS



- Physical moves
- Life stages
- Catastrophic events
 - Unexpected, sudden changes



Each transition involves loss as well as potential gain




WHAT HAPPENS WITH EACH TRANSITION OR CHANGE?
